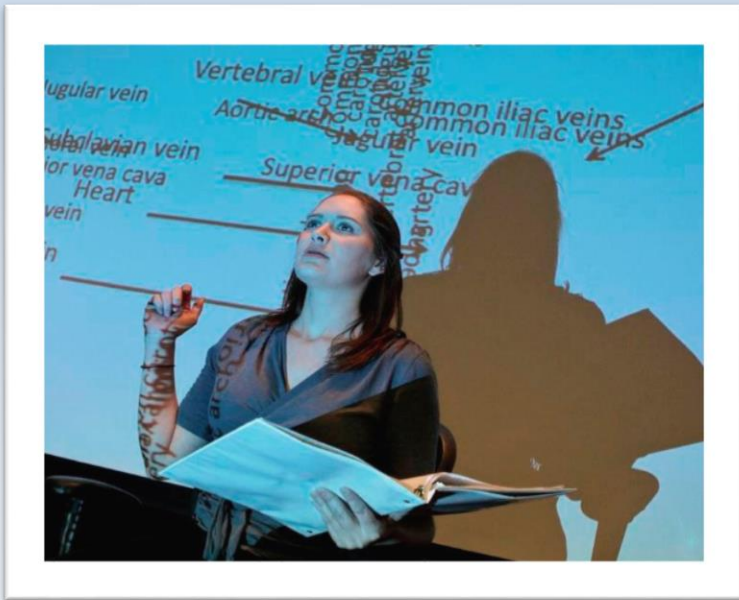


THE AUTOPSY OF DR. MELINDA J. SMITH
