2025 UVA Orthopaedics Surgery Alumni Conference

Allie spoke about how integral Dr. Chhabra and the team at UVA Orthopaedics were to her recovery from injury and the restoration of her life and function. She is now a world class paralympian rock and mountain climber and runs a

Modly was a patient of former faculty and chair Dr. Gwo-Jaw Wang who nearly lost her leg from a malignant bone tumor in 1981. Along with the chair at the time, Dr. Warren Stamp, Dr. Wang and his team resected the tumor and performed a reconstructive knee surgery that restored her ability to dance and play sports for over 40 years. Robyn expressed her gratitude for Drs. Wang's and Stamp's expertise and kindness during her surgery and recovery and showed a recent video of her dancing to demonstrate the long-term success of the operation.

Outside of the lectures and discussions in the conference room, alumni, faculty, and spouses enjoyed a special dinner at Level 10 downtown. It was great catching up with former residency classmates, faculty, and friends. Dr. Wang even brought a couple bottles of cognac to celebrate the occasion! The conference closed with a special event for alumni and faculty at the clubhouse at the UVA Baseball Game on Saturday afternoon against Pittsburgh. UVA Head Coach Brian O'Connor visited with the group at the conference before the game and discussed building culture within an organization and the current landscape of college sports
